Thirty calendar days have transpired since the mailing to you of a Proposed Order of Revocation. Your failure to make a timely appeal of such order authorizes this agency to issue a Final Order of Revocation based on the Finding(s) of Fact and Conclusion(s) of Law set forth in the Proposed Order of Revocation. The following is hereby entered:

Finding(s) of Fact:

- 1. You were a teacher employed by the North Thurston School District during the 1990-1991 school year, teaching at Timberline High School.
- 2. During that school year you had intercourse with a student at Timberline High School, resulting in her pregnancy.
- 3. You have been determined to be the father of her baby by Thurston County Prosecutor's Office and an order to that effect has been set forth by Thurston County Superior Court. You are being assessed child support for that baby. You agreed to that order.
- 4. You also approached that student's sister, making inappropriate verbal sexual advances.
- 5. You were discharged by the North Thurston School District through hearing.

6. During the course of the investigation by this office you met with the Chief Investigator and during that meeting you deliberately misrepresented and omitted material facts.

Conclusion(s) of Law:

You have violated the Washington Administrative Code, committing acts of unprofessional conduct as outlined in section 180-87-080(1)(2) Sexual Misconduct with Students and section 180-87-050(7) Misrepresentation or Falsification in the Course of Professional Practice.

Based on the above Finding(s) of Fact, the Superintendent of Public Instruction has determined you lack the good moral character and personal fitness to hold an educational certificate in Washington in that you have a behavioral problem which poses a danger to students, as outlined in section 180-75-081(3).
