PROSECUTING ATTORNEY CASE SUMMARY AND REQUEST FOR BAIL AND/OR
CONDITIONS OF RELEASE

The State hereby incorporates by reference the Certification for Determination of Probable Cause prepared by Renton Police Detective Tanya Dorn on August 22, 2002, for Renton Police Department case number 2001-3266.

REQUEST FOR BAIL

The State requests bail in the amount of \$10,000, cash or bond. The defendant is a threat to the community. According to the police reports, the defendant has a well-documented history of sexual abuse allegations. In 1992 (Kirkland Police Department Case number 92K1728), for example, several fourteen-year-old girls at Holy Family School in Redmond, Washington, accused the defendant of inappropriate sexual contact. At the time, the defendant was their basketball coach.

The police reports indicate that the defendant is still operating Players Only and continues to coach young girls. The defendant also has numerous misdemeanor convictions.

The State further requests that the defendant be prohibited from having any contact with the victim, [REDACTED] and any of the potential witnesses identified and/or referenced in the police reports and discovery materials. Given the nature and history of the allegations, the defendant should also be prohibited from having any contact with minors, regardless of supervision. The police reports indicate that the defendant's business partner and brother, Lance Giles, was aware of the numerous allegations against the defendant. Despite the allegations, Mr. Giles apparently made no effort to intervene. Mr. Giles told Detective Dorn that the defendant has "had problems with girls in the past as he is such a hands on type of

1 guy." Mr. Giles added that "Tony is Tony and he ~~doesn't care~~
2 ~~about allegations~~." Clearly, no level of supervision will
3 protect minors from the defendant.
